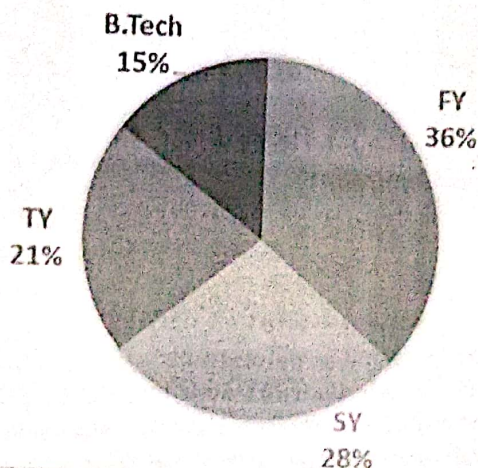

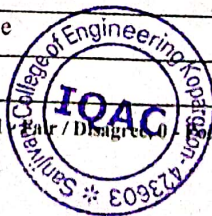

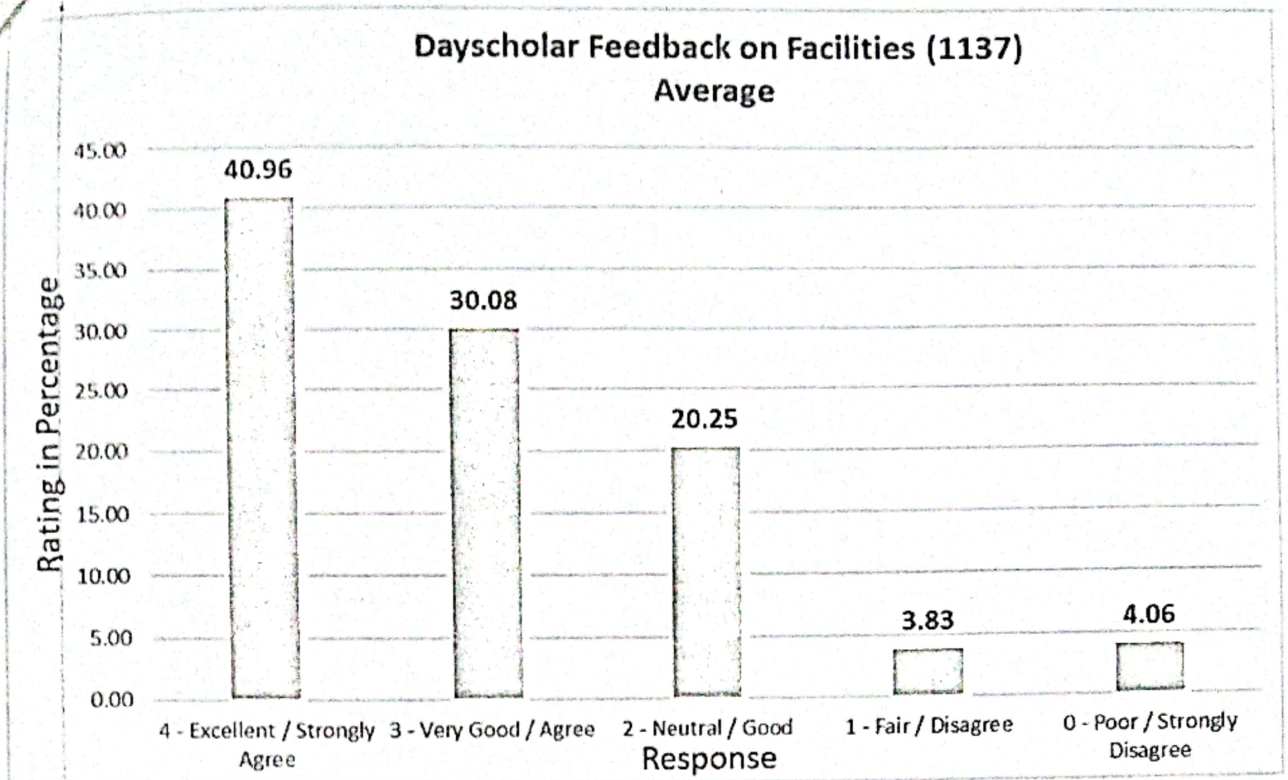

Figure 1 presents the average rating of the questionnaire based on the Dayscholar students' feedback on facilities for the Academic Year 2025–26 (Semester 1). The analysis shows that **92.11% of the responses fall under the satisfied category**, while **only 7.89% indicate dissatisfaction**. Since the dissatisfaction level is **well below the institutional benchmark of 15%**, no corrective actions are required at this stage. The feedback reflects that the institute's facilities and infrastructure are performing at a very satisfactory level, meeting the expectations of the majority of the Dayscholar students. Therefore, it is recommended that the institute **continue to maintain and further strengthen the existing infrastructure and facility standards** to sustain student satisfaction.

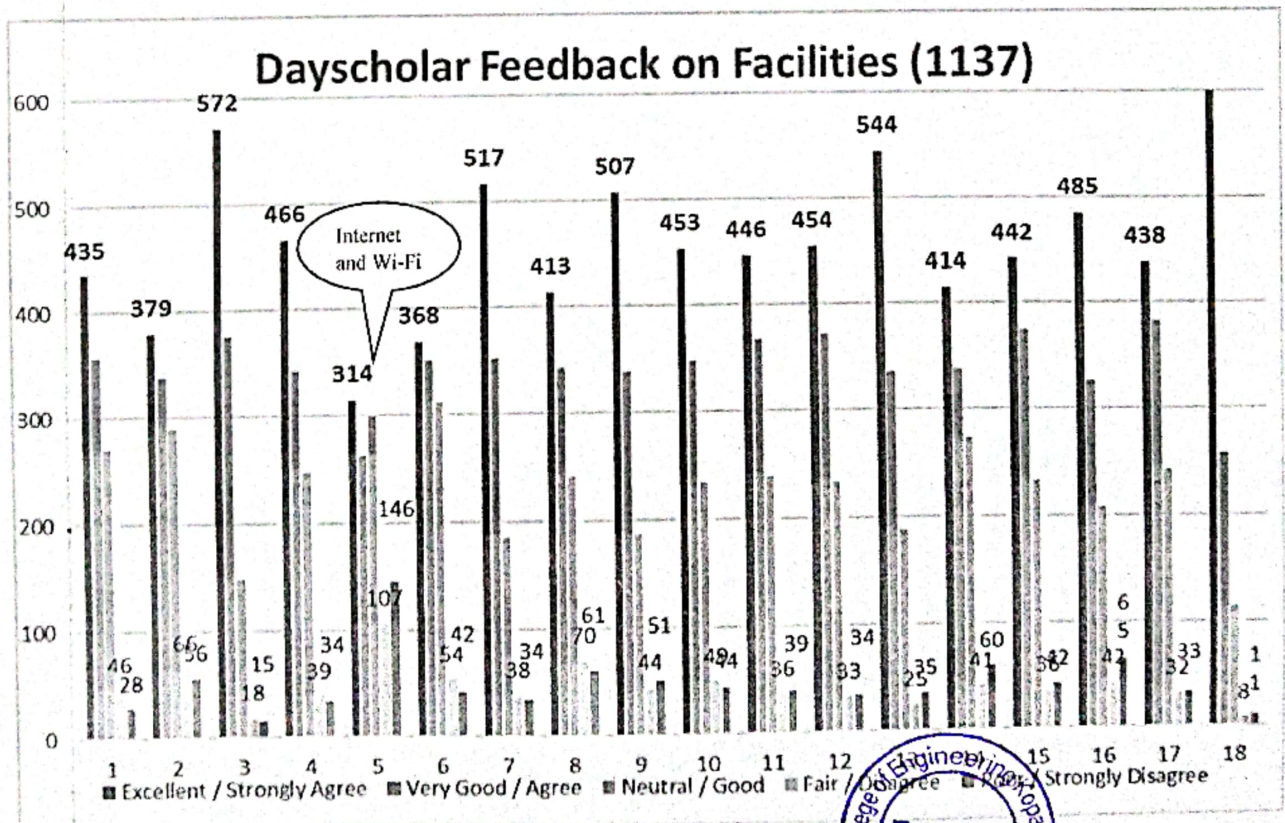

Figure 2 presents the Dayscholar student survey responses for the parameter "Accessibility of Wi-Fi & Net Speed" in the institute. From the survey analysis, it was observed that 77.57% of students are satisfied with the accessibility and speed of the internet, while the remaining 22.43% of students expressed dissatisfaction. Since the dissatisfaction percentage exceeds the institutional benchmark of 15%, it clearly indicates the need for improvement in this service area. The responses show that students expect better connectivity, higher bandwidth availability, and improved stability of network services. Therefore, corrective actions are required to enhance the accessibility and performance of Wi-Fi and internet facilities within the campus.

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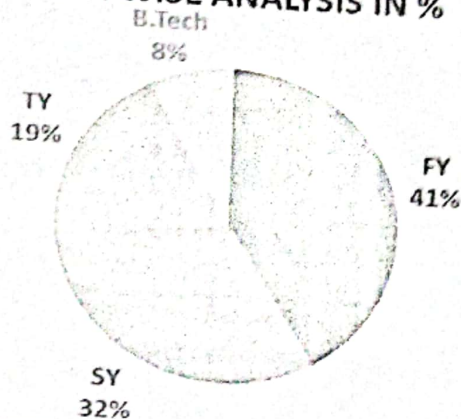

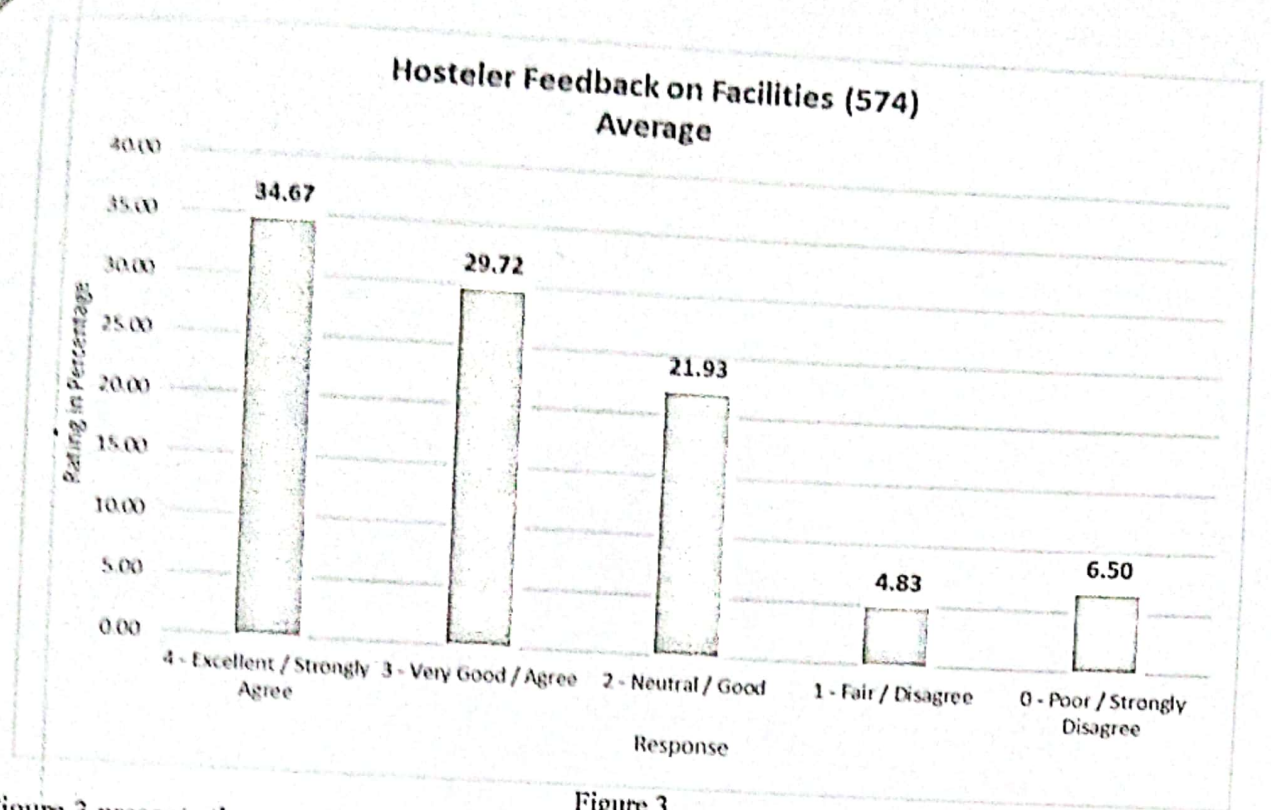


Figure 3 presents the average rating of the questionnaire based on the Hosteler students' feedback on facilities for the Academic Year 2025-26 (Semester 1). The analysis shows that **88.67% of the responses fall under the satisfied category**, while **11.33% indicate dissatisfaction**. Since the dissatisfaction level is below the institutional benchmark of 15%, no corrective actions are required at this point. The feedback indicates that the overall hostel facilities and services are functioning at a satisfactory level and meeting the expectations of the majority of hosteler students. Therefore, it is recommended that the institute **continue to maintain and further strengthen the existing hostel infrastructure and support facilities** to ensure sustained student satisfaction.

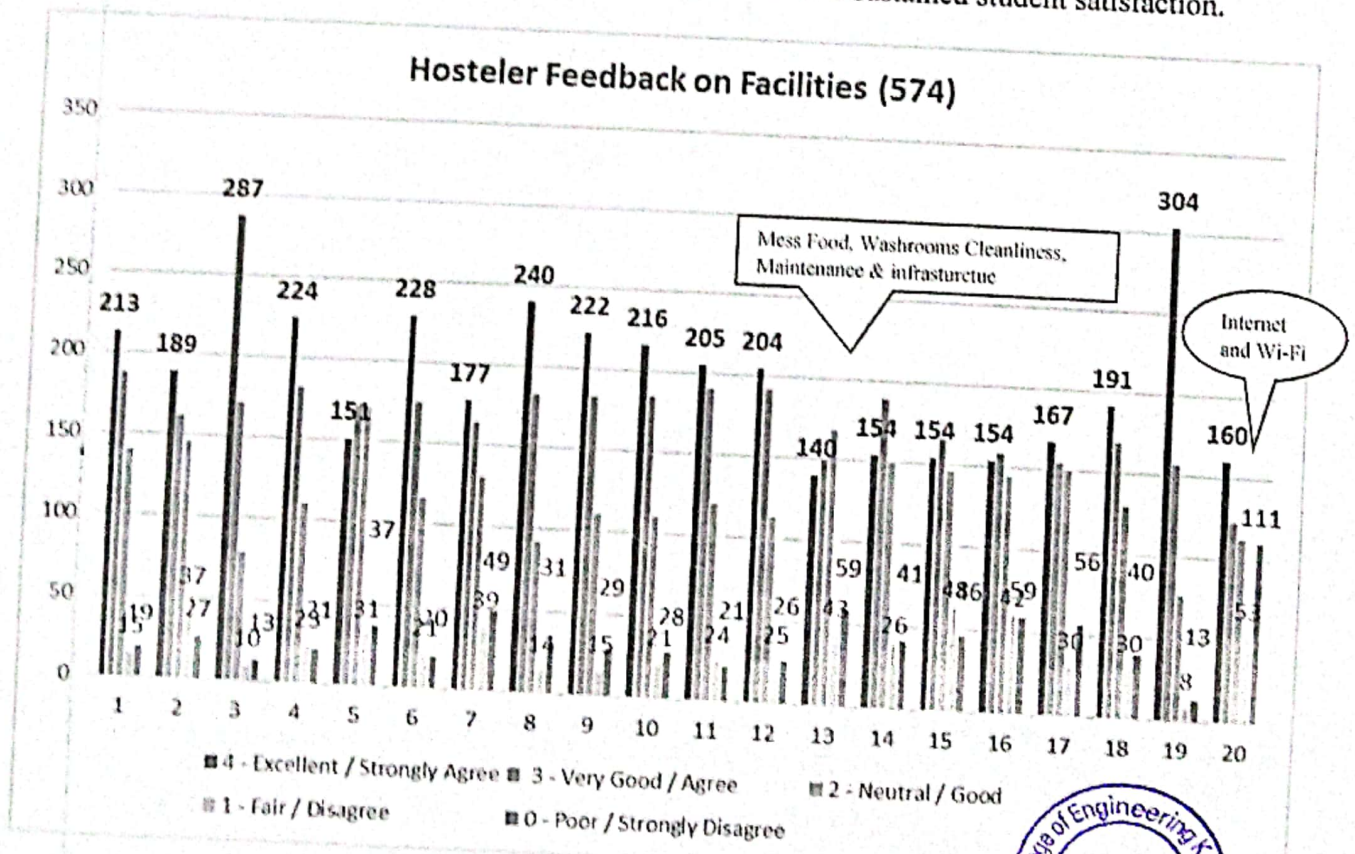

Although the overall hosteler feedback appears satisfactory, the parameter-wise analysis shows that several facilities have dissatisfaction levels above the 15% benchmark.

Figure 4 indicates higher dissatisfaction in **Quality of Food in the Mess (18.21%)**, **Cleanliness in the Washrooms (16.79%)**, **Hostel's Room Maintenance (18.07%)**, **Hostel Infrastructure (15.41%)**, and **Quality of Internet and Wi-Fi Facility (29.29%)**. These values highlight the need for focused improvements in food quality, sanitation, room upkeep, infrastructure, and internet connectivity. Since these parameters exceed the benchmark, an action plan is required. Measures should include strengthening mess quality monitoring, improving washroom cleaning, enhancing room maintenance processes, upgrading hostel infrastructure, and prioritizing digital infrastructure by increasing bandwidth and Wi-Fi coverage. Implementing these steps will help address student concerns and improve overall satisfaction.

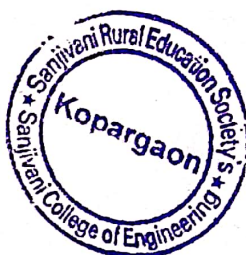

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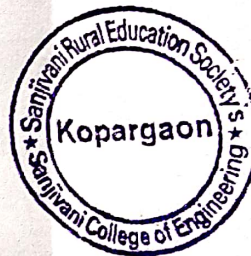
